## <u>Leadership of Change</u>

- Our school's values have been co-created with all stakeholders. Our values are visible in our daily interactions. As a result, we provide a welcoming, nurturing and supportive learning environment for our school community.
- Effective analysis of data has resulted in appropriate targeted and whole school interventions and improvement priorities
- School improvement is driven by rigorous self- evaluation, consulting all stakeholders
- There is a culture of collaboration within the school where staff share their ideas, practices and strategies.
- Staff meet in various working groups to help drive forward priorities for improvement. This year's foci are curricular areas (Digital Literacy, Health and Wellbeing, Literacy, Numeracy & Outdoor Learning).

- Across our school there is a positive, calm and inclusive ethos. Almost all children engage well almost all of the time. High levels of engagement are underpinned by our nurturing principles.
- The views of children are gathered across the school in various ways including questionnaires, focus and pupil voice groups.
- Our learners are successful, confident and responsible. They contribute to the life of the school.

- Staff have actively engaged in professional learning to support the quality of effective questioning.
- Application and personalisation and choice of learning is evidenced through the creative use of digital tools in Primary 7.

- Our school is warm and welcoming.
- Across the school, almost all children feel safe and well cared for. Children can identify adults they trust and have the confidence to speak to staff if they feel worried or unsafe.
