



Pokemon Cards

If the cards are so precious to them, then they should not bring them to school to trade. I would greatly appreciate it if you could speak to your child about this.

Do you know that idling vehicles parked on Glasgow's roads are contributing to the air pollution problems in our city? There are regulations in place to deal with this and you could be faced with a fixed penalty ticket for idling your engine unnecessarily.



For the sake of all of us, especially our children, **<u>do not</u>** sit in your car with your engine running.

Parking in Private Lane

Following a recent meeting with the co-owners of 37-42 Dorchester Court, 1 Dorchester Place, they have informed me that parents of Kelvindale Primary are parking their cars down their private access lane during school pick-ups. This rear access lane leads to residents' car garages, bin stores and back gardens. Not only are they parking there, but these parents are also leaving their engines running, which is both a pollution issue and a nuisance to the residents. They can also find it difficult or impossible to get their own cars out during these times.

A resident raised a huge concern that a parent had got out their car and allowed their child to use their garden as a toilet.

It is important that we in Kelvindale Primary have a good relationship with our neighbours. Please find an alternative place to park that will not upset local residents. This will also help to ease congestion around the school. Thank you.
